THE FORMER HOMES OF THE LODGE

At this period when so much attention has been given to the building of a new Temple it is interesting to look back over the records and bring to light some of the pictures of the former meeting places of the Lodge.

In the early days few suitable places were available and the Brethren made the best use of such quarters as that time would permit.

Being unable to build a lodge home they rented hall space for more than twenty years.

Brother Ard Godfrey built the first house in St. Anthony and Minneapolis. In the private parlor of this home the first Communication of Cataract Lodge U. D. was held, Saturday, February 14, A. D. 1852, A. L. 5852, at 7 o'clock P. M., pursuant to previous arrangement for the transaction of regular business.

This is the first recorded meeting of the Lodge and this historic house is still preserved in Chute Square, where it serves as an object of historic interest to Minneapolis, but more especially so to the Brethren of Cataract Lodge because it was their first home.

The first lodge hall used was located on Main street N. E., just above Fourth avenue. Here Cataract Lodge No. 121 was constituted on October 21, 1852.

From this place the Lodge moved to a hall in the building later known as the Tremont House, at Main street S. E. and Second avenue. Later it moved to the King Building two blocks further down and remained there until the building was destroyed by fire.

For a time the Lodge had no regular quarters but met in such places as could be had temporarily. In 1857 a hall was secured in Capt. John Rollin's building at Second avenue S. E. and Prince street. This building is still in existence.

The records do not indicate any other lodge quarters until the construction of the building at University avenue and Bank street in 1874, and which the Lodge has occupied for a period of 52 years. At the time this building was completed the Lodge had just about 200 members. The construction of the building was considered quite an achievement in that day and the Lodge quarters were for a considerable time the finest in the state.

THE ASSOCIATE BODIES

The history of the associate bodies which meet in the same quarters as the Lodge dates back nearly as far into the past as that of the Lodge itself. Some of the same Brethren assisted in the organization of the Chapter and the Commandery. The original facts and incidents connected with the formation of these bodies are here presented.

ST. ANTHONY FALLS CHAPTER

In 1857, eight Royal Arch Masons in St. Anthony petitioned the General Grand Chapter for a dispensation to form a Royal Arch Chapter. Dispensation was granted January 5, 1858, by Charles Gilman, G. G. H. P., to form St. Anthony Falls Chapter No. —, Minnesota Territory, with the following officers in the G. C.: R. S. Alden, E. H. P.; A. E. Ames, K.; and E. B. Ames, S.

The Warrant of the Chapter is a Charter granted to it on September 15, 1859, by the General Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons, and approved by the Grand Chapter of Minnesota.

DARIUS COMMANDERY

The establishment of Chivalric Masonry in Minnesota took place in St. Paul when a Commandery of Knights Templar was formed by authority of a dispensation issued on July 7, 1856, by W. B. Hubbard, Grand Master of the Grand Encampment of the United States. This organization took the name of Damascus Commandery No. 1. On September 7, 1865, three other Commanderies were chartered, Zion Commandery No. 2, at Minneapolis, with A. E. Ames as the first Commander; Coeur de Lion Commandery No. 3, at Winona; and Mankato Commandery No. 4, at Mankato.

These four Commanderies after considerable activity prior to the dates of their charters met in St. Paul on October 23, 1865, where, upon authority from H. L. Palmer, Grand Master of the Grand Encampment, they formed the Grand Commandery of Minnesota.

It was not until six years later that the Fratres in St. Anthony formed Darius Commandery No. 7 under a dispensation granted to it on February 1, 1871. The charter was issued by the Grand Commandery of Minnesota on June 24, 1871. The first officers under the charter were:

The Grand Council of Royal and Select Masters of Minnesota was formed at St. Paul on December 12, 1870, by representatives of St. Paul Council No. 11, Minneapolis Council No. 15 and Rochester Council No. 16, all chartered by the Grand Council of Iowa. After the organization of the Grand Council of Minnesota the above Councils were renumbered and the Charters endorsed by its authority.

On January 11, 1876, a Charter was granted to Adoniram Council No. 5 to form a Council of Royal and Select Masters in East Minneapolis. The Council was duly organized with the following officers:

THE BUILDING COMMITTEE

The Building Committee was appointed in 1914 by Wor. Bro. W. C. Watson. With but few changes in personnel at times of activity it has been in continuous existence to this time.

The first plan submitted was a building at the rear of the old Lodge with a wing extending through to University avenue north of the old building to contain stores and to serve as an entrance and lobby on this more important street. This proposition was rejected in 1916.

No further plans were studied until four years later. In the meantime the Finance Committee had improved the financial basis of the Lodge by revision in dues. As a result of these conditions demands for action were again revived.

In 1920 a plan was submitted for a building at the rear of the old building for lodge use only. The advisory committee appointed to work with the active committee on the project advised further delay and the Lodge concurred in the recommendation.

In 1924 action was again urged and the committee produced the plans which, after much thought and labor, finally brought the new Temple into being.

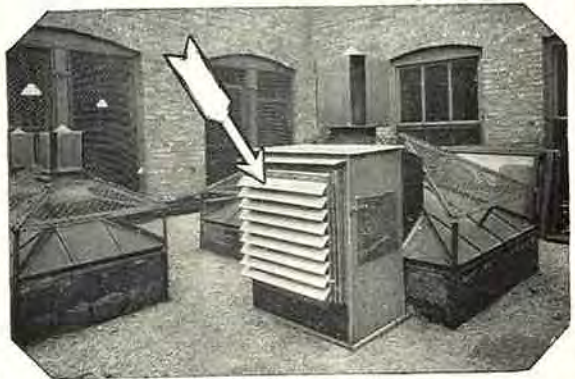

THE ARCHITECTS AND THE PLANS

The Building Committee agreed that the design of the new Temple should be prepared by one or more of the three architectural members of the Lodge. It was endeavored to have them associate themselves in some way for the purpose, but there appeared to be certain obstacles in the way of this and the idea had to be abandoned.

Several proposals were made and after consideration the work was awarded to George O. Huey who had charge of all arrangements for the planning of the structure. With him were associated W. K. Macomber and R. A. Anderson. The latter two became members of the Lodge during the progress of the work.

Several of the members of the Building Committee, having presided over the various associate bodies and knowing well the requirements of a lodge working floor, made the general layout of the lodge floors, apartments and special features and then turned them over to the architects for the basis of the structural and architectural design of the building. The designs, treatment and interior embellishments were developed by Bro. Macomber and applied to schematic layout prepared by the committee. These were submitted to the Lodge and adopted.

The general contract was awarded to R. S. Billingsley & Co. The mechanical contract was awarded to the Belden-Porter Co. Ground was broken on April 6, 1925, with a formal ceremony under the direction of the Lodge.

The corner stone was laid by the Grand Lodge A. F. & A. M. of Minnesota on August 11, 1925, just 51 years to a day after the laying of the corner stone of the old building.

The new Temple is a credit to the architects and the builders in all its appointments, and stands as a memorial to the original site of the first settlement in East Minneapolis, in which the charter members of the Lodge participated.

THE NEW TEMPLE

Cataract Temple, at the corner of Central avenue and Fourth street, occupies the whole plot of ground which is 98 feet by 155 feet in dimensions. Besides the two streets an alley separates the building on the other long side from the adjacent property.

The building is semi-commercial, having rental space in the basement, stores on the first floor and offices on the second floor looking out on the two streets. There are eight stores and ten offices as arranged at present. The building has four main floors with some additional space for special purposes on the fifth floor.

The exterior is of hammered brick with glazed terra cotta trim. The architecture is Gothic of a semi-modern design to allow for commercial use. The entrances, of which there are two—one on each street—are beautiful examples of Gothic art. Except for the three conventional panels the design contains but a touch of emblematic work. These doorways, as well as other ornamentation, give the building character and beauty which at once makes it attractive and inviting.

The sub-basement contains the heating plant and ventilating systems. There are two boilers, a hot water heater and tank, and a vacuum return pump. The ventilating system supplies the banquet and lodge rooms with heat and clean air. Two large fans supply the air which can either be drawn fresh from without or be recirculated. In either case all of the air will be washed by water spray before entering the supply flues. The heated air enters the grilles in all the rooms so supplied and returns at the floor line. In winter the air is heated and in summer by the use of cool water the temperature can be reduced by spray washing and the rooms made comfortable when necessary. The temperature of the rooms is automatically controlled as required. All other parts of the building except those above mentioned are heated by direct radiation.

The basement proper contains some storage rooms, but the remaining space is commercial and is suitably arranged for club or bowling alley purposes.

The first floor is divided into store space which is up-to-date and splendidly located. The second floor offices can be reached by way of either entrance, and they are conveniently joined by a suitable corridor.

On this floor also is located the main hall, which is to serve for drills, ball room, banquet room and auditorium. The entrance is at the head of the main entrance on Fourth street. The corridor at the head of the stairs is beautifully finished in natural gum wood. French doors open into the ball room and also into the staircase to the apartments above. A

well-equipped check room is conveniently located at the left of the main entrance. The main hall has a clear space of 50 feet by 100 feet. At the east is a stage with a 27-foot proscenium. There are entrances at each side of the stage with small dressing rooms adjacent thereto.

The room is beautifully designed in Italian Renaissance and the decorations are striking and artistic. The floors are marble terrazzo with brass expansion strips and coves at the walls. The walls are also decorated with woodwork panels of birch finished to show the natural beauty of the wood. The upper walls are embellished with balconied windows set with art glass and artificially lighted when required. The ceiling is grilled for heating and ventilation. The stage is tastefully draped and has a paneled mural landscape, which adds to the depth and beauty of the room. The lighting fixtures are of the bracket type at the walls, augmented by crystal chandeliers, which aid in making this ball room one of rare beauty and attractiveness.

The kitchen and pantry are adjacent to the dining room and arrangements have been

made for direct or cafeteria service at hours of refreshment. The kitchen is equipped with artificial refrigeration for food and water cooling. The appliances in the kitchen also include a dish-washer, gas range, steam table, dish-warmers, coffee urns and working tables. A fully equipped cupboard is in the room adjacent to the kitchen, which can also be utilized as a serving room when a large number are served at banquets.

Continuing up to the mezzanine floor by the main stair attention is at once attracted by the caine stone markings. While these have no specific meaning they are intended as a reminder of the marks used by operative Masons of other days. This work is known as Italian "caffito" and is a feature of all the stair halls as well as the main ante room. The stair halls are further beautified by windows of art glass and appropriate lighting schemes.

At the head of the second flight of stairs is the main lounge or parlor, which will serve as the congregating place for many gatherings. Across the room is a large alcove fitted up as a library and writing room and to the right of this is the checking room and retir-

ing room for the ladies. The parlor is a reminder of the Elizabethan period or English Renaissance. It is further decorated by an ornamental fireplace of artistic beauty. The floors are paneled marble terrazzo.

On this floor also is located the men's checking room, telephone booth, Secretary's office, men's smoking room and a smaller dining room with service from the kitchen below by dumb waiter. This dining room is suitable for most ordinary gatherings. On this floor are located the Commandery lockers, well situated between the drill floor below and the asylum above.

Leaving the lounge room the way leads up the Grand Stair Case flanked on the right and left by ornamental Greek torchieres, and beautified by cathedral windows. It terminates in the main ante room, which is adjacent to both lodge rooms. This ante room is Spanish of modern period. With its brick and stone trim, oaken doors, hammered hinges, bracket lamps, tile floor and fountain it is made to represent an outdoor garden from which access is afforded to the lodge rooms.

The arrangement of the lodge room floor is unique and the plan was governed by the requirements of the work in the different bodies. Each lodge room is an interior apartment and is completely surrounded by a corridor for processional purposes and proper access, as well as to eliminate external noises as far as possible. On the Central avenue side is a long robing room and on the opposite side is a smoking room and three committee rooms for meetings, examination of visitors and coaching purposes.

The small lodge room, or Roman room, is 35 feet by 44 feet. It has a small ante room and a private preparation room. In the west is a small stage and lantern screen. Both east and west have suitable drapes. The chairs are of the opera type and the furniture is that used for many years in the old building and which has been transferred for use as a reminder of the days gone by. The room is of Roman Doric design with modern appointments. It is comfortable and attractive and will prove serviceable for the majority of the ordinary gatherings and meetings of all bodies.

The large lodge room or Greek room, is complete in all its appointments. No mere words are capable of properly describing it. The design is classic Greek Doric. The arrangement and decorative scheme is noteworthy and make this room one of rare

beauty and distinction. The floor area is 54 feet by 82 feet. A fully equipped stage in the west has a 21-foot proscenium. The dome, representing the heavens, is illuminated by colored lights on dimmers. On the north and south walls above the seating platforms are free standing columns separated by decorative panels and on the recessed walls back of them are beautiful mural landscapes of classic nature, suggesting the mystery of a glorious period of the past when civilization had established itself in a barbarous age.

The east is symbolic of the creation of Light and is especially appropriate. The decorative work leads the contemplative mind into another world. The lighting is unique and pleasing. The furniture is of a design harmonizing with the general features of the design. The murals and the lighting effects accentuate the space and distance depicted therein. The whole room is a work of art in pure Doric and provides surroundings long to be admired. The carpets and lodge chairs have been selected to harmonize with the general surroundings and coloring of the room. The lodge is equipped with a pipe organ and all of the appurtenances and apartments for work in all the Masonic bodies of the York Rite.

Macomber.

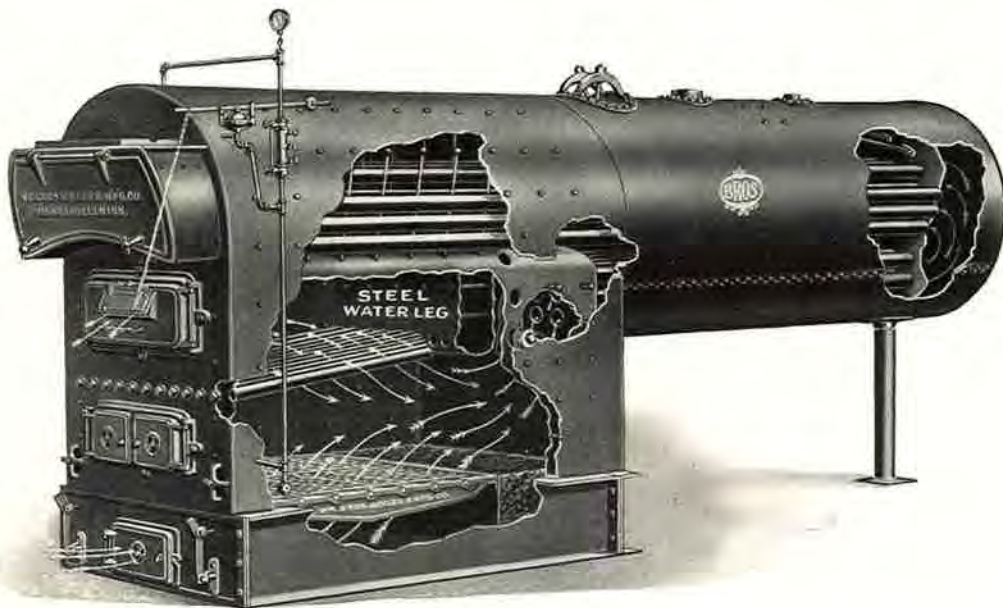

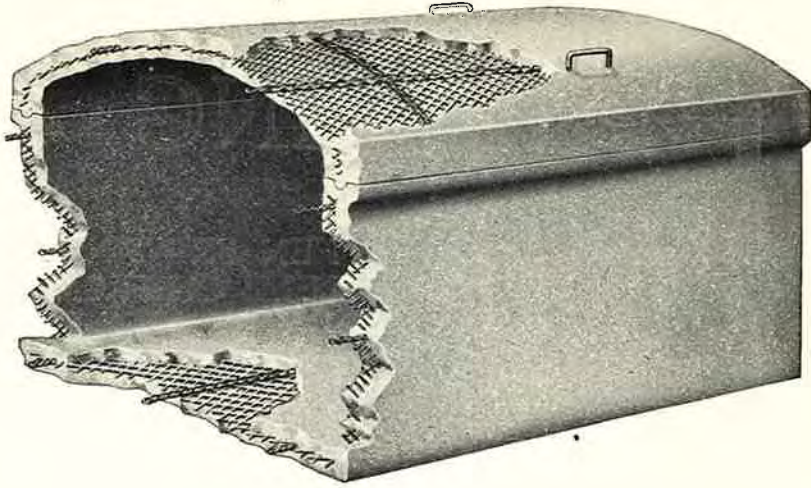
